The Aims of the Project

The project GAMMA aims to direct students' knowledge of digital games and their connection thereto to enhance their mathematical skills. Since teachers should have a leading role in this process, the project aims to develop educational materials that will be useful to mathematics teachers who want to use game-based learning (GBL) founded on digital technology.

The Target Groups

The target groups are mathematics teachers who teach students aged 14-18 years in all project countries and their students.

Expected Outputs

- Provide insight into different educational systems in European countries
- Create a GAMMA handbook for teachers
- Develop focused authoring systems (FAS) for the production of digital games
- Create a teaching scenario template; 8 teaching scenario examples and 5 games connected with them concerning GBL

Kick-off Meeting

The 1st Transnational Project Meeting was held virtually on November 19-20, 2020. It was organised by J. J. Strossmayer University of Osijek – Department of Mathematics, Croatia. The meeting was an introduction to what awaits us during the project and it was attended by 30 GAMMA team members.
